New Year Blues?

We often hear the term 'January Blues' or 'February Blues'. I know that children can feel this more than ever at the start of the school term once the fun and sparkle of Christmas is boxed up again for another year. In fact, I think we can all feel quite low at times when daylight hours are few and the weather is damp and cold.



Although we no longer keep the Christmas tree up at St John's until February like I hear my predecessor Revd David Butlin did, we do keep the Christmas spirit going for a while. Firstly, we mark the visit of the Magi to the Christ child at 'Epiphany'. Then a few weeks later, usually at the start of February we celebrate Candlemas. This recalls the time when Joseph and Mary took the child Jesus to the temple to make an offering of thanks to God and is also traditionally the time when new candles are brought into church and blessed for the year.

This special festival is also called Candlemas because of what happened next that day in the temple. Two holy and devout people, who had worshipped all their lives in the temple waiting patiently for the Messiah, realised something when they set eyes on Jesus. One was Anna, my namesake, and one was Simeon who described what he saw in the Christ child as the salvation of all the world and a light to lighten all people.

Elton John wrote a song called 'I guess that's why they call it the blues' about two people who are waiting for the time when they'll be together again. Sometimes we can feel low and wonder when we'll feel brighter again. We too might be waiting for better days.

Unlike Anna and Simeon we no longer have to wait for Jesus. Those who are Christians dare to believe that Jesus is with us all the time, always there to lighten our darkness and warm our hearts by his reassuring presence and peace.

You are all always welcome to St John's or the Evangelical church on the green (or of course any of the Oxted churches too) to find out more, or do contact any of the local ministers if you are feeling the blues and fancy a chat. And if you'd like to come to a Candlemas service, why not try our 9.45am on 5th February at St John's? This is a beautiful service for all-ages and if you have a baptism candle for you or your child please bring that along too and we will light them to remind us Jesus is always with us, which he is, even when we have the blues. Save our frogs and toads

Over the next few weeks you may catch sight of frogs and toads crossing the road near St John's Church at, and approaching, the junction between Church Way and Oast Road.

What are the differences between frogs and toads? Frogs have smooth, moist skin, and they aren't slimy! They tend to jump rather than crawl. Toads, on the other hand, have drier skin. They don't need to spend their lives so close to water. They lumber about when they move instead of hopping.

Both frogs and toads are known as amphibians because they live partly on land and partly in the water and travel back each year to the pond where they were bred. This happens in late winter/early spring after it begins to get dark and often following a rainy day. They don't like the cold so the temperature needs to be reasonably mild otherwise they will stay put in someone's garden for a little longer in their snug spot in the undergrowth, or a woodpile, or a hole in the ground. Then when the conditions seem right, they set out on their journey – and they don't have any road sense!

So, from early or mid-February until early April there are likely to be frogs and toads in Church Way and in Oast Road near the T-junction in the hours after dusk. These little amphibians can be seen and avoided if we drive slowly and carefully in that area.

We have a Toad Patrol in place to help them on their journey, but sometimes we don't have enough people to cover the whole of an evening.

Without any effort by me, the black leaf celandine will be everywhere by the time you read this, the dark leaves are a dramatic frame to the yellow flowers.

The soil in our gardens can vary a lot from street to street. If you have not already done this, get a simple testing kit to measure the acid level in several places in your garden. A plant in the right place will thank you much better than trying to grow one in an unsuitable place. This applies to fruit and vegetables as well.



What is Lent? Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year is on Wednesday 22 February. Lent is a period of six weeks (40 days not including Sundays) leading up to



Easter. Lent is in spring, when the days begin to get longer and is an old English word meaning 'lengthen'.

What is the story of Lent? Jesus went into the desert to fast and pray before beginning his work for God. Jesus was tempted several times by Satan, but was able to resist. Lent allows Christians to remember Jesus's fasting in the desert. It is a time of giving things up and a test of self discipline. There are many foods that some Christians do not eat in Lent, such as meat and fish, eggs, and milk. Some Christians give up something they really enjoy, such as cake or chocolate.

How do people celebrate Lent? Some Christians start celebrating Lent the day before Ash Wednesday on Shrove Tuesday. You may have heard this called pancake day. This is because this day was traditionally the time when Christians would use up food they would not be eating during Lent. On Ash Wednesday many Christian churches hold services during which Christians are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. This is a sign of saying sorry to God for any wrong-doing.

Lent Mid Week Services at St John's start on Wednesday March 1st at 12noon weekly for six weeks followed by a light lunch. We hope to see you there!

I'm starting this article with some clues – if you've got local knowledge, or you are of a certain age, you'll know the answer! The clues - a precious stone, port conflict, a Tandridge village location and a river to the east. The answers are HMS Amethyst, a confrontation with communist forces, St Peter's church, Tandridge and the Yangtze river in China. Together, they form the Yangtze Incident. This took place on 20th April 1949, when the frigate, HMS Amethyst, steamed up the Yangtze river to relieve HMS Consort at Nanjing, as she prepared to evacuate British and Commonwealth citizens caught up in the advance of the Chinese communist forces.

HMS Amethyst came under fire from communist shore batteries and received over 50 hits. Holes below the waterline were plugged with hammocks and bedding. HMS Consort steamed at high speed in a rescue attempt but then also came under fire. Return fire disabled some of the enemy shore batteries and Consort attempted to tow Amethyst to safety. However, this attempt had to be aborted. Consort also sustained heavy damage casualties and fatalities. Six days later under cover of darkness, Consort successfully towed Amethyst off the mud to a point upriver. HMS London and HMS Black Swan then attempted to rescue Amethyst but came under fire and further fatalities and casualties resulted. At this point Lt. Cmdr. Kerans took command and started negotiations and the wounded were evacuated by sampan. Negotiations continued for many months. The Chinese insisted that Kerans sign a statement that Amethyst had wrongly invaded Chinese national waters and had fired upon them first; Kerans declined to sign and ultimately decided to make a break for open waters.

On July 31st under cover of darkness, Amethyst steamed downstream and began a 104-mile escape. She came under heavy fire but putting down thick black smoke confused the communist gunners on the shore. At full speed they broke through the boom at the mouth of the river and made contact with HMS Consort. 46 men were killed, and they are remembered at the National Memorial Arboretum.

Lt. Cmdr. Kerans, DSO RN, subsequently served as an MP (Conservative for Hartlepool). He died in 1985. The connection to Tandridge village? Kerans is interred in St Peters churchyard in Tandridge. Several ESW walks pass through or nearby the churchyard.
