"One toot and you're oot"

My wife Gillian recently went out for breakfast and came back raving about a local café's "amazing" breakfast. I decided to visit said café last Saturday to experience this culinary delight for myself. I was



sorely disappointed; I will not be returning to said café for their breakfast again. To use a colloquial Scots phrase my mum very much liked, "one toot and you're oot!" My "one toot and you're oot" attitude to the café reminded me of a conversation with the new CEO from my previous employment. He was very keen to let me know how much he valued me and that he would support me as an important member of staff, which was a nice carrot. Then came the stick - if I ever "disappointed" him in any manner that would be the end of my employment. A somewhat extreme management style I feel and a literal take on the "one toot and you're oot" school of thought. As I have started to prepare for Easter, I have realised that disappointment runs throughout the Easter narrative. Think on it. The crowds that welcomed Jesus as the conquering King quickly became disappointed when He refused to live up to their expectation. The religious authorities were very disappointed with Jesus that He refused to acknowledge their authority, intellect or importance. Both the crowd and the religious authorities certainly took the "one toot and you're oot" option which led to Jesus hanging on a cross at Golgotha. Yet the greatest disappointment must have been Jesus', betrayal, abandonment and denial by those closest to Him. Judas traded Jesus' life for thirty silver coins, Peter denied Him publicly three times and the rest ran for their lives and hid. On top of the physical torment and pain of the cross there was undoubtedly the emotional anguish of His friends utter betrayal. Jesus must have been very disappointed indeed with His friends and disciples. It would have been only reasonable for Jesus to have cursed them and railed against His friends and disciples, wouldn't it? Jesus would have been justified adopting a "one toot and you're oot" attitude with His worthless friends, wouldn't He?

Let's fast forward to a breakfast around three weeks after Jesus' crucifixion. The risen Jesus has just cooked breakfast for His friends on the shore of Galilee. This event in itself is remarkable but what Jesus does next is astonishing. Jesus restores Peter, the man who publicly denied Him, the man who ran and hid, the man who was notably absent from the crucifixion. Note that it is Jesus who calls Peter back to follow Him, it is Jesus who came to Peter, it is Jesus that reinstates Peter as His disciple. None of what happened was Peter's idea rather it was Jesus'. I am sure Peter felt that he had "tooted" and he was very much and forever "oot", but Jesus didn't.

I am thankful that with God it is never "one toot and you're oot". The true theme of Easter is not disappointment but hope. With God and through Jesus' life, death and resurrection there is always hope for those who have fallen like Peter, like me and like you. I may well give that local café's breakfast another try this Saturday. *Keith Dickson, Pastor, Hurst Green Evangelical Church*

Hosting a Ukrainian family in Hurst Green

We were lucky enough to welcome a lovely Ukrainian family into our home just before Christmas. The family had already been in the UK, based in Oxted for 6 months, so we are their second host family. Although we had looked at the scheme initially, to be

honest we were put off by the finding and sponsoring process and the inevitable red tape of all these schemes. For us being a second host was the perfect solution enabling us to support a family whilst avoiding as much British

bureaucracy as possible! The family, having been uprooted from their home in Ukraine, had worked so hard to establish themselves in the local area with school places, friends and jobs it seemed devastating to be rehoused, potentially out of area. And so our family of four extended to a family of 7.

As well as enriching our lives with lots of delicious new cuisines, we have enjoyed learning about the Ukrainian culture and traditions, especially over the Christmas period. However, the experience is also giving me a new opportunity to experience many of our systems through new eyes. And my overwhelming feeling, having dealt with the local authority and Universal Credit, is one of sadness and frustration. My experience is that our systems are convoluted and difficult to navigate, without the added additional challenge of English being your second language. I am often left to explain things to our guest that actually make absolutely no sense at all. I feel completely bemused and slightly embarrassed about how difficult we make everything. For example, the family of three are currently housed with us, under the Homes for Ukraine scheme, in two bedrooms however, when bidding on local authority accommodation there is no option to request anything smaller than a three bedroom. I understand that the two schemes are different, but I wonder at what point we take away someone's ability to decide for themselves about their living situation. For many cultures whole families sleep in one bedroom and yet despite a catastrophic shortage of housing we continue to insist that a family of three cannot share a one or two bedroom property. I just wonder if we are adding to the local housing problem. Without a guarantor or deposit for private rental, with many private landlords avoiding tenancies with people on Universal Credit and with over 700 local families waiting for council accommodation ahead of our guest, I think that continuing to be housed under the Homes for Ukrainians scheme may well be the only option for many families.

I know that for some it may seem challenging to be a host family but if you have a spare room I urge you to consider being a second host. Not only do you have the added benefit of being able to meet the visitors ahead of agreeing to host, you can also talk to their previous host and really try to find a match that fits with your own family.

As a community, I am always so warmed by Oxted's generosity and kindness. I wonder if we could challenge ourselves to try and maintain some sort of continuity for these families who have already arrived in the area.

Have you got Voter ID? If you want to vote in a polling station at the local elections on Thursday 4 May, you'll need to bring photo ID with you, otherwise you won't be able to



vote. This is a new requirement following changes to the law

Your ID needs to be the original (not a photocopy), and can be a passport, driving licence (including provisional licence), Blue Badge, identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme), certain concessionary travel cards, biometric immigration document, defence identity card, or a national identity card. If you have one of these IDs, but it is out of date, you can still use it to vote at a polling station if the photo on it still looks like you. You don't need to provide photo ID to vote by post.

If you don't have any of these items, you need to apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate by 5pm on 25 April.
