**REPORT FROM THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL:** James Ashton, Oxted Team Rector, joined the PCC meeting on 21 September. We considered our 2024 'Pledge' for the Diocesan Parish Support Fund, and agreed a figure of £65,500, a slight increase on this year's, but, due to financial uncertainty, less than the 3.3% suggested by Bishop Christopher. Hurst Green Village Fair was very successful and the bouncy castle made a profit of around £150. Sam Stolz was appointed as a second Parish Safeguarding Officer, to join Charlotte Nicholls. Emma Kemp has joined the St Agatha's Committee. Solutions to address the tripping hazard of the plinth under the font are in hand.

**TEAM VICAR INTERVIEWS:** We are delighted to have three good candidates to be interviewed on Monday 25 September. The Archdeacon has advised that this is due to our strong profile, as there are far more vacancies than potential applicants. After coffee on arrival, the candidates (who must be kept separate according to new guidance) will be shown round the parish, including Crowhurst, the Church and Vicarage, followed by lunch, meeting different church members at each stage. Any successful appointment will not be made public immediately.

**TACKLING CLIMATE CHANGE TOGETHER:** Monday 16 October 2023, 7 - 8.30pm at St John's Church. Talk by A Rocha UK Speaker, Karen Park, with questions, answers and discussion. Karen is an Authorised Lay Minister and Eco Church Champion at Silver Eco Church, St. Mark's, Holbrook, and Eco Church Lead for Horsham Churches Together. All welcome.

**WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER:** Shirley Dare has been our representative for this event for many years, and is willing to continue, but needs the help of someone else. This is especially important because, in March 2025, it will be the turn of St John's to host the annual event. It is not normally an arduous a task, simply a meeting in November and then circulating information about the event in March. But in 2025, it will involve a little more around the meeting time.
