**GREAT IS THE COMPANY OF WOMEN:** It is 30 years since women were first ordained to the priesthood. Our own assistant priest, Mary Seller, was among them. On 23 March there was a service at Southwark Cathedral to mark this anniversary and to celebrate women's ministry in the Church. Mary trained for ordination once the decision was made by the Church and was ordained deacon in 1991. She had to wait another three years for the ordination of women to the priesthood to actually take place.

**REPORT FROM THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL:** The PCC met on 21 March which was Revd Sue's first time as Chair. This was the last meeting for Hilary Dilnot, Emma Kemp, Peter Langham and Charlotte Nicholls, although some may stand again at this year's elections. As usual, the PCC covered a wide range of topics:

**Lay Conference on 2 March** - Six people from St John's attended and reported on various workshops. Useful practical suggestions emerged on what could be provided for the older generation. Information on the prevalence of violence against women was alarming, with figures similar for a church congregation as elsewhere. Churches were advised on how to develop awareness and signpost how to get help. Some speakers offered to visit churches, including one happy to discuss initiatives with local eco groups.

**Church grounds** - St John's is very fortunate to have extensive and beautiful grounds which are enjoyed by church members and the community, but hours of work are required to maintain them. We are grateful for the volunteers who help but the bulk of the work is undertaken by a paid gardener. He is honest and reliable and charges a preferential rate, but it still involves considerable expense when the church is facing a deficit. There are also ideas to incorporate more 'eco' aspects, and perhaps other ventures such as growing fruit which could be used by the Community Fridge. Henk, churchwarden, offered to come up with an alternative plan to be brought to the next PCC meeting. This could involve keeping the visible parts neat and trim and not worrying so much about those other areas out of sight. Working parties for specific tasks could be organised when necessary. It was noted that a number of people turned up to clear the Vicarage garden before a new Vicar arrived!

**The Crossing the Threshold Group** is exploring options for hosting community projects, such as a DWP Job Centre drop-in service; creative art sessions for people with dementia and Café Milk, for new mothers to meet, share experiences and receive breast-feeding support. There will be an update on progress in the May Newsletter.

**Fundraising events** suggested, to help increase income but also as social occasions, include a quiz night, beer tasting and chilli, barn dance, afternoon talks with tea and cakes. Further ideas are welcome, as are offers of help in organising events.

**The importance of safeguarding** Safeguarding Officers, Charlotte Nicholls and Sam Strolz, spoke on this subject. They will wear badges in future so you can identify them, and let them know if you have any safeguarding concerns. It is proposed to explore this area more fully at the next PCC meeting with the new PCC on 24 June.

**IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING DOMESTIC ABUSE:** Women can call the free national helpline 0800 200 247 at any time. Men can call the men's advice line 0808 8010 327, Monday to Friday 10am - 8pm.

**ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING:** This will take place on Sunday 12 May at 11.15am in the church after the Parish Eucharist. There will be elections for PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives. Please consider whether you would like to stand for election to serve your church in this way. To find out more, speak to a current PCC member; names (with photos) are in the porch.

**ARE YOU ON THE ELECTORAL ROLL?** This is the basic list in every parish of all those entitled to become a sidesperson and vote in, or stand for, elections within the church. If you are not already on the electoral roll and would like your name added, please complete an application form, from the table at the back of church, and return it to Barbara Richards, Electoral Roll Officer (either by hand or via the 'R' pigeon hole in the porch). The closing date for additions is 24 April and names may not then be added until after the APCM.

**AN EARLY END TO THE FROG AND TOAD MIGRATION:** A big thank you to everyone who has for the past few weeks helped out with the Toad Patrol at the junction of Church Way and Oast Road, and to those drivers who slowed down for us. The number of rescues was markedly down on previous years: 47 this year, compared with 164 last year and 104 the year before. It's likely that the very mild and very rainy February accounts for this, with many of our clients having made their move 2-3 weeks early and, to a great degree, when no humans were about. It's been an unusual season, but fortunately one with very few known casualties. *Thanks again Adrian*
