This is an opportunity to give thanks to God for the past year and to look ahead in hope and prayer for all that lies ahead. There will be elections for PCC and Deanery Synod; do consider standing. To find out more about the PCC, speak to a current member; names (with photos) are in the porch. Completed forms should be given to Janet Harman.

DIOCESAN SYNOD ELECTIONS - BE THE CHANGE: New Diocesan Synod members are to be elected to serve for three years. There are three meetings a year, two Saturdays and one weekday evening. Pick up a leaflet from the table to find out more and read a message of encouragement from Revd Lotwina Farodoye, Chair of the House of Clergy. To stand for election to the House of Laity, you would need to be proposed and seconded by a Deanery Synod member (Janet Harman and Liz Parker for St John's).

THE HURST GREEN SINGERS' SUMMER CONCERT is on Sunday 12 May at 7pm in Bawtree Hall, Hazelwood School. The programme features a traditional and contemporary Mass. Mozart wrote the Missa Brevis in F major when he was only 18 and it is regarded as a pinnacle of his early masses and is sometimes nicknamed 'Little Credo Mass'. In contrast, Missa Deus Nobiscum by Philip Stopford was first performed in 2019 in Belfast and the Kyrie has a noticeable Celtic overtone and the whole piece is a beautiful, melodic work.

Tickets (£15 or free for under 18s) are available via the website www.hurstgreensingers.co.uk or can be purchased on the door (card reader only). It promises to be a wonderful evening of memorable music and we hope you will join us.

SOUTHWARK VISION 2024 - 2035: Southwark Vision is Christ Centred and Outward Focused. Fliers, giving a brief summary of the refreshed Diocesan Vision and priorities, are available on the table in church, together with prayer bookmarks. Please help yourself! There are plans for members of the Bishop's Senior Team to meet every parish over the next two years, starting in September, to listen and understand more fully the joys and challenges in specific contexts, and identify useful additional support.

PRAYER FOR ELECTIONS: This year is being dubbed 'the great election year' as there will be between 42 and 60 taking place across the world. Locally, elections are taking place on 2 May, the same day as the London Mayoral elections and our General elections must happen by 28 January 2025. Remember you must now present a form of photographic identification in order to vote. Southwark Diocese urges churches to be 'election ready' and urges us to pray for all leaders, regardless of what party or personalities are in power: our Government, our capital, our communities and our nation, and that the Holy Spirit will give us wisdom as we head to the polls. See 1 Timothy 2: 1-2 'I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people - for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.'

THY KINGDOM COME, 9 - 19 May 2024: This global ecumenical prayer movement which began in 2016, invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.
